Our season opener begins with the massive Chaconne from Bach's 2nd violin partita, orchestrated by our own Maestro Butorac. Performed by Serbian phenom Robert Lakatoš, Wieniawski's wickedly virtuosic concerto sets the stage for Brahms' masterpiece of tragedy and exuberance, the finale of which pays tribute to Bach, bookending this blockbuster program.

The ten movements in *Pictures at an Exhibition* serve as musical illustrations of drawings and watercolors by Viktor Harmtmann, a dear friend of Mussorgsky's who died prematurely. Originally composed for piano, the symphonic version we love today was orchestrated by Maurice Ravel at the request of famed Russian conductor Serge Koussevitzky. In the final, and perhaps most recognizable movement, Ravel unleashes the full power of the orchestra through his vision of the Great Gate of Kiev. Though several of Hartmann's visual works are lost, they are immortalized in this vibrant musical masterpiece.

Composed in 1930, William Grant Still's "Afro-American" symphony was the first written by an African-American to be performed by a leading American orchestra. Our concert opens with a new work by Jennifer Higdon (commissioned, in part, by TSO) that captures the spirit of the Western Carolina mountains. Copland's iconic *Lincoln Portrait* tells American history through narration and visuals. A brand new photochoreography work, with archival and contemporary photo submissions from our community, will celebrate Tallahassee's past and present to kick off our city's 200th anniversary!

With six movements, Mahler's colossal 3rd Symphony is the longest, and one of the greatest works in the standard symphonic repertoire. His "midday dream" takes us on a journey from the heat of a summer day, to a flowery meadow, through the forest and finally, to a profound conclusion unlike anything Mahler had written before.
