CONCERTMASTER POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT

The Tallahassee Symphony Orchestra (TSO) is pleased to invite applications for the position of Concertmaster. The organization seeks an exceptional musical leader who is eager to connect with the orchestra and Music Director, become part of the TSO community, and who wishes to advance the TSO's mission to "engage, enrich, and inspire through great music."

THE POSITION: The Concertmaster of the TSO will perform a minimum of 30 services per season. The appointment will begin in January, 2027 (appointment start date is subject to negotiation).

HOW TO APPLY AND DETAILS: Interested candidates will submit a resume and one unedited video (see audition repertoire for details) by Friday, September 5, 2025.

Four finalists will be contracted to lead the Tallahassee Symphony Orchestra in concert during the calendar year 2026.

The TSO is a member of the National Alliance for Audition Support.

COMPENSATION: The TSO is a per-service orchestra, and the position will be compensated at \$250/service. If necessary, a travel and housing stipend will be provided to the winning candidate.

THE TALLAHASSEE COMMUNITY: Tallahassee is nestled in the rolling Red Hills region of Florida's panhandle, a biologically diverse area designated one of America's "Last Great Places" by the Nature Conservancy. Moss-draped oak trees and stately pines give a distinctly Southern feel to this vibrant capital city, which serves as both the epicenter of Florida politics and home to 3 thriving institutions of higher-education.

Tallahassee's fascinating history interweaves stories of Apalachee and Spanish peoples in the 16th century, territorial and oppressive governments in the 19th century, and Civil Rights advocacy and national politics in the 20th century.

In the TSO's DNA is its relationship to Florida State University, having been founded by the spouse of a former FSU faculty member in 1981, Nicholas Harsanyi. Since that time, the TSO has benefitted from a close and robust relationship with the university's esteemed College of Music.
